We invite applications for a two-year full time Postdoctoral Research Fellow position in **social identity**, **mental health**, **and exercise** within the School of Kinesiology at The University of British Columbia (UBC). The successful applicant will work under the supervision of Dr. Mark Beauchamp (Director of the Psychology of Exercise, Health, and Physical Activity Laboratory; PEHPA Lab) and Dr. Eli Puterman (Director of the Fitness Aging and Stress Laboratory; FAST Lab). The position will primarily involve working on a randomized controlled trial (RCT) that is designed to test the efficacy of a program (*Purpose After Service through Sport*: PASS) to support the well-being of Military Veterans in Canada (funded by Veterans Affairs Canada), but will also include work on other projects being conducted within the PEHPA and FAST Labs. The successful applicant will work closely with Dr. Beauchamp and Dr. Puterman in developing resources for the PASS Trial, managing the trial, and will be responsible for overseeing the data collection team, performing advanced quantitative data analyses, and leading/contributing to report and publication writing.

Candidates should hold, or expect to hold by the time of appointment, a doctoral qualification in a relevant domain of social, exercise, and/or health psychology and have a research background in social identity processes, mental health, and/or the exercise psychology. Sound knowledge of experimental design (including conducting RCTs), as well as expertise in advanced statistical methods would be invaluable. The successful applicant will possess excellent knowledge of intervention implementation, evaluation, knowledge mobilization, as well as strong interpersonal and organizational skills.

The salary is \$70,000 CDN per annum plus eligible benefits. The work will be carried out in the School of Kinesiology at UBC (Vancouver), as well as at trial sites across Canada.
